**Interview Questions** 

## Where are you from?

I've lived in Clearwater, Florida for the past 22 years, but my roots are from as far away as California and Denver.

## How did you become a doll artist?

I was looking online one day and came across the beautiful dolls made by Patti Culea and I was inspired to try and make my own. I didn't know how hard it would be! Thankfully Patti's training got me on my feet and I was off and running, mostly to the craft store for more materials.

## How long have you been a doll artist?

I began in 2013, so I'm still learning every day. I try new things often and about half the time I come up with a working method.

## Where do you find your inspiration?

One of the most inspiring people I know is doll maker Tanya MontQ. Her style and techniques delight me to no end! I'm so inspired by great ladies of the past and fashion trends from the 1780's to the 1980's. I aim for a doll which is somewhat timeless, pulling from the past to create a sense of quality and refinement.

## Do you belong to any doll making groups?

I belong to "Professional Doll Makers" run by Jack Johnston, an institution in the doll making community.

## Do you teach, and if so, where do customers find that information?

I don't currently teach so those who come to me looking for cloth doll making instruction, I refer to what got me started <a href="www.pmcdesigns.com">www.pmcdesigns.com</a>

## What materials do you feel are "must haves" when working with doll making?

Great skin fabric like Kona is a must. It holds up to anything you put it through and looks great.

# What tips or tricks do you have that you would like to share (doll making, sewing, etc.)?

It really helps to start your doll career as a quilter. You need to become an expert with your sewing machine as well as build up the patience that it takes to work through the doll making journey. I now have two Husqvarna Vikings and use them everyday.

## Do you have a personal message you would like to share with our customers?

My best advice is to try as many different methods and tutorials as possible. Seek out and converse with doll maker's whose style you admire. Ask for help. Join networks

and go to meetings. Work with easy to get materials and become as self-sufficient as possible. Organization is vital to having a functioning workspace. Get an organized friend to help you lay out and plan your work area to work for you.

# Do you have a blog, Facebook page, Pinterest page, etc. you would like to share? What is the information for these?

Yes I do. Blogging, pinning and posting are a needed break from doll making. It adds balance to your workday and I think promoting yourself is key to reaching your audience.



It is with great sadness that we say goodbye to the talented doll artist, designer, teacher, friend and fellow Jersey Girl BUNNY GOODE who left us on May 25<sup>th</sup>. In the words of her devoted husband Ed in a Facebook post:

"It's so difficult to even write this, let alone say it out loud ... Bunny left us yesterday at 2:00 pm, finally having to concede after a many years long fight with cancer. For those so incredibly fortunate to have known her personally, you'll all be glad to know she was kicking cancers ass the whole way ... it may have finally beaten her, but she left a lot of marks on that bastard while going down."

And that is SO BUNNY!!! In another post Ed lovingly wrote:

"I can think of no nicer tribute to Bunny than the (quite literally) thousands of contacts we have received expressing how she touched so many lives. Funny thing is, she never thought she was anything other than some old hippy chick that liked to play with dolls ... A wonderful lady named elinor peace bailey, that Bunny greatly admired, authored a book called Mother Plays With Dolls that sort of sums up the thinking ... Artists, in general, are a unique group of characters, and I'm convinced that doll artists (for the uninitiated, yes, that is an official description, likely coined by some nutty doll maker) are among some of the most imaginative, abstract, odd, loving, soul-bearing and just plain nuts people in this world. And Bunny was so proud to be a part of that group ...."

Mary Ann will dearly miss her many long, chatty phone conversations with BUNNY about so many wonderful things. Her indomitable spirit through it all was amazing. Cheers to you, BUNNY!
